D. Project F.U.N! (Ms Ong Yiu Yah, teacher i/c)

1. As part of the Character and Citizenship Education (CCE) Department's effort to develop student leadership, the P4 and P5 cohorts have undergone a leadership training module in which students are taught problem solving skills and Project Management skills respectively.
